WELCOME TO THE VALE OF BERKELEY RAILWAY

The Sharpness branch line ran from Berkeley Road, on the Gloucester to Bristol mainline, to Sharpness and its docks. It then linked to Lydney and the Forest of Dean collieries via the now dismantled railway bridge over the River Severn. Although the Sharpness branch closed to passenger traffic in 1964, part of it is still used for transferring nuclear waste by train.
